ACCESSIBILITY INFO

Your accessibility guide for today's visit.

This handout outlines accessible routes, toilet locations, gradients, communication support and key facilities around the Safari Park. Use it to plan your journey through the Road Safari and Foot Safari and to identify the areas and services that best meet your needs.



KEEPER TALKS AND DEMONSTRATIONS

Download today's timetable – it's the best way to see all the animals in the Foot Safari. If you require any additional assistance please let a member of staff know. Some talks use a microphone to amplify the keeper speaking to the audience. For visitors sensitive to noise, please consider using ear defenders as required.



COMMUNICATION BOARDS

There are five communication boards at Woburn Safari Park to help individuals communicate about a wide range of topics including the animals, leisure facilities, food and drink and self-care.



BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE USERS

Find the British Sign Language signs dotted around the Park today, during your visit. This is the most commonly used form of signed communication and uses hand movements, shape, and facial expressions to communicate.



SEN FRIENDLY WORKSHOP DAYS

On selected dates, these include a 60 minute educational workshop designed for children with special educational needs and disabilities. Enjoy a self-drive safari adventure in the Road Safari then select from a choice of activities, like mucking out, sensory learning, preparing feed or making enrichment.

The Road Safari is one way only. Please stay on the road with your doors and windows closed at all times

Disabled toilets are available on the end of the Admissions Building (largest building with a wavy roof). On a busy day this area becomes congested with traffic, so please enter the Park via Husborne Crawley gate MK43 0XB and park safely alongside these toilets, without blocking access for keeper vehicles.

Your next toilets are located after you finish the Road Safari, which may take around 60-90 minutes. See details on the Road Safari map.

♿ Disabled Toilets

Standard disabled toilets with open access are located in the Safari Restaurant **29**, Mammoth Play Ark **13** and next to the Safari Hangout **3**. Disabled toilets with radar key access are located in the Courtyard, please ask in Junglies Gift Shop **28** for a radar key.

♿ Changing Places

The Changing Places accessible toilet **37** facility is located beside the disabled parking in the concrete car park. This is fitted with hoists, privacy screens, adult-sized changing benches, a peninsula toilet and has space for carers. Please ask staff in Junglies Gift Shop for the radar key.
